## 2010 TRUST AND BETRAYAL

This year's Odyssey returns to the 2007 setting of Gersau and the dazzling Lake Lucerne. Opposite Gersau lies the Rütli Meadow, at which—legend has it—a secret pact united the first three (erstwhile stubbornly independent) cantons against the Habsburg oppressors

## EXCURSIONS

**Lucerne** Among the Odyssey's special events is a boat ride on the breath-taking Lake Lucerne. Doing the forbidden, the youthful Carl Jung once tried to launch a boat on this lake. We will debark in Lucerne, where you are free to explore on your own. You might stroll from the harbor to the Culture and Congress Center designed by the French architect Jean Nouvel. We heartily recommend a visit to the Rosengart Collection, which holds over 200 modernist works—including some 100 by Paul Klee, and 180 by Pablo Picasso. The boat ride back to Rotschuo takes place under the stars.



**Rütli Meadow** This trip begins with a boat ride to the old harbor of Treib, where already in the Middle Ages refugees gained shelter from persecution. We continue by train to a plateau in Seelisberg, and walk onward to the mystical Rütli Meadow. Our return boat cruises by the Schillerstein—a 30-meter-high natural stone obelisque, unreachable by land, and dedicated in 1859 to the author Friedrich Schiller. Here, too, the Swiss hero Wilhelm Tell is said to have plunged into the stormy lake to save himself from capture by the Habsburgers.

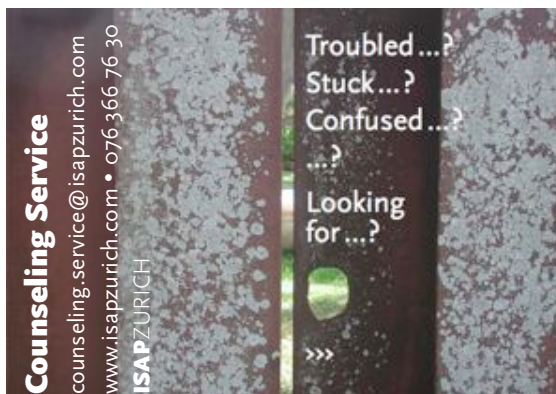
# ISAPZURICH

AGAP is a founding member of the International Association of Analytical Psychology (IAAP), with training privileges. In 2004 AGAP established the International School of Analytical Psychology Zurich—ISAPZURICH.



**ISAP** On the home turf of the renowned Swiss psychologist CG Jung, ISAP conducts full-time post-graduate training that leads to a Diploma in Analytical Psychology. As a member of the Swiss Charta for Psychotherapy, ISAP is recognized by the Health Department of Canton Zurich as a psychotherapy training institution.
