Stefan Brunnhuber

Stefan Brunnhuber, MD, Ph.D. is a trained auto mechanic who went on to study medicine, philosophy and sociology of economics. He is a Dahrendorf-Schüler, specialist in psychiatry, and was for many years senior physician in psychiatry at the University in Würzburg, stress and affective disorders. His special interests are psycho-traumatology, chronic pain, complementary medicine, mind-body-medicine, integrative psychiatry, and public health. He is guest professor in several international schools. Presently he works as senior physician in psychiatry at the University Clinic Salzburg, in psychiatry II. He is also actively engaged in Eastern and Western spiritual traditions. Americans call him the „Renaissance man“ and the Buddhists „JamYang Dorje“ (unbreakable wisdom).

Avis Clendenen

Avis Clendenen is Professor of Religious Studies and the Sister Irene Dugan, r.c. Scholar in Spirituality at Saint Xavier University in Chicago, teaching courses in the area of practical theology and the intersection of Christian spirituality and depth psychology. She holds a Ph.D. and D.Min., Chicago Theological Seminary. Mary Dougherty is a Jungian analyst and art psychotherapist in private practice in Chicago. She graduated from the C.G. Jung Institute of Chicago in 1995. She also holds Masters Degrees in Art Therapy and in Performance Art and Experimental Photography. She is Director of Training at the Jung Institute of Chicago. She has also published in many Jungian Journals. Her lectures focus on the clinical implications of gender, the use of active imagination, and on the impact of Jung's thought upon creative development and artistic production. As a printmaker and performance artist she exhibited nationally and internationally. She was awarded the 'Lifetime Achievement in the Arts' award by the Chicago Women's Caucus for the Arts.

Her doctoral dissertation, for her Ph.D., involved researching the psychological after-effects of incest in women who were sexually abused as children. She taught there for ten years, and has devoted herself to private clinical practice in Heidelberg and Frankfurt, Germany with adult individuals and couples for the past twenty years. In the past three years she has lectured and has given workshops on "Forgiveness and Individuation" at several Jung Societies in the United States, Canada and in the U.K.

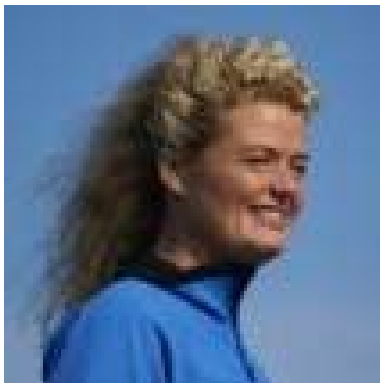


Peter Mai

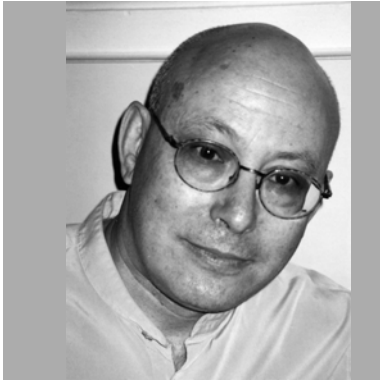
Claudia Nagel
