The International School of Analytical Psychology Zurich (ISAPZURICH) was established in 2004 under the authority of the Association of Graduate Analytical Psychologists (AGAP), a Swiss domiciled association founded in 1954. To date AGAP counts some 650 international members.

On the home turf of the renowned psychologist C.G. Jung, ISAPZURICH conducts full-time post-graduate training that leads to a Diploma in Analytical Psychology. True to the Zurich tradition ISAP's faculty members, guest instructors and trainees from around the world contribute a variety of professional and cultural backgrounds. Lectures and seminars are held in German and English, while personal analysis and supervision are conducted in a number of additional languages. Graduates qualify to apply for membership in AGAP and the International Association for Analytical Psychology (IAAP). Members are entitled to professional practice as Jungian analysts and psychotherapists, depending on regional laws.

ISAPZURICH reaches out to a greater community by opening its lectures to the public. Continuing education programs are offered for general interest, as well as for the special interests of professionals within and outside of the field of psychology. ISAP's Counseling Service consults with individuals seeking analysis or psychotherapy and refers them either to ISAP analysts or to diploma candidates of the training program. Therapy and analysis are offered in a number of languages, including German, English, French, Italian, Swedish, Spanish, Portuguese, and Japanese.

JUNGIAN ODYSSEY

The JUNGIAN ODYSSEY is an intensive study program designed for students and professionals in the field of psychology, irrespective of orientation. The program also welcomes all other individuals with interest in Jungian ideas.

Each year, the ODYSSEY takes place in a different region of Switzerland, thus providing the opportunity to absorb the essence of Jung through the soul of the land itself. It is surely an enhancement to study Jung in the places that directly and indirectly influenced his particular approach to the psyche.

With lectures, seminars, colloquia and experiential workshops, the first part of the JUNGIAN ODYSSEY invites immersion in the varied approaches that comprise Jungian theory and practice. Among the topics treated are dreams, fairytales, picture interpretation, collective issues, the relationship of psyche and soma. With the same format of lectures, seminars and workshops, the second part of the ODYSSEY explores the cultural and archetypal dimensions of special geographic locations in Switzerland.



JUNGIAN ODYSSEY 2006 takes place in the heart of Switzerland, in Flüeli-Ranft, near Lucerne. The area of Flüeli-Ranft was home to Brother Klaus, held by many to be the patron saint of Switzerland. He spent the last 20 years of his life here as a hermit in prayer and fasting, sustained in body and spirit by the land and his strength of religious belief. In the midst of this natural setting, one

senses that the land has a psyche of its own. The temenos of the land, and the model of life in dedication to the sacred, will be the keynote for the 2nd part of the ODYSSEY.

PILGRIMAGE CHURCH IN HERGISWALD

Among the special events of the JUNGIAN ODYSSEY is a journey to the pilgrimage church of Hergiswald, about one hour's ride away. The church dates back to the time of the German hermit, Hans Wagner, who lived for almost 30 years in his hermitage in the midst of the forest. He died in the year 1516. The church is famous for its ceiling with more than three hundred (324) emblems of Mary, each one symbolizing a different aspect of her nature. Within the church is the Loreto Chapel with the Black Madonna of Loreto. The chapel itself is a replica of the famous Santa Casa (Holy House) of Loreto in Italy.

To register for the JUNGIAN ODYSSEY, please fill out the accompanying form and return to ISAPZURICH by postal mail or fax as below. Enrollment is limited, so we encourage early registration. Upon our receipt of your full payment, your registration will be confirmed and you will be notified about particular details.

Please Note: (1) Registration *prior* to March 31st 2006 has the advantage of a lower participation fee, as well as cancellation refunds from 100% - 40%. After March 31st the participation fee increases by CHF 100 - 200 (or USD equivalent), and cancellation refunds are forfeited. (2) Although the Odyssey formally concludes on Saturday July 15th, the return trip from Flüeli-Ranft to Zürich takes place on the next day, Sunday July 16th. (3) Your place in the conference is reserved *only* when we receive your registration *and your payment of the full participation fee*. When both items are on our records, we will send written confirmation of your registration and reserved conference place.

Cancellation For cancellations in due time, ISAPZURICH will refund fees paid as follows: by January 31st 2006, 100%; by February 28th, 60%; by March 31st, 40%; after March 31st, forfeit of all refunds.
