Haruki Murakami and Japanese Medieval Stories Between Pre-Modern and Postmodern Worlds

Japanese novelist Haruki Murakami is considered one of our greatest living writers. He has been called by the *New York Times* the “unofficial laureate of Japan,” “its chief imaginative ambassador,” and “the primary source for millions of readers of the texture and shape” of Japan today. Murakami’s novels, including *Norwegian Wood* (1985), *The Wind-Up Bird Chronicle* (1995), *Kafka on the Shore* (2005), and his magnum opus, *1Q84* (2010), seem to depict a postmodern world that has no fixed ego or stable relationships. At the same time, his works show remarkable similarities to Japanese medieval stories. In these lectures, Dr. Kawai will interpret Murakami’s novels in relation to Japanese medieval stories and show that the essential features in both involve interpenetration of this world and another world and the emergence of the subject from a story without subject or borders. Further, he will investigate these features in light of the Japanese worldview and Buddhist philosophy. Finally, he will show how the pre-modern way of being is still significant for our contemporary psychotherapy and way of life.
