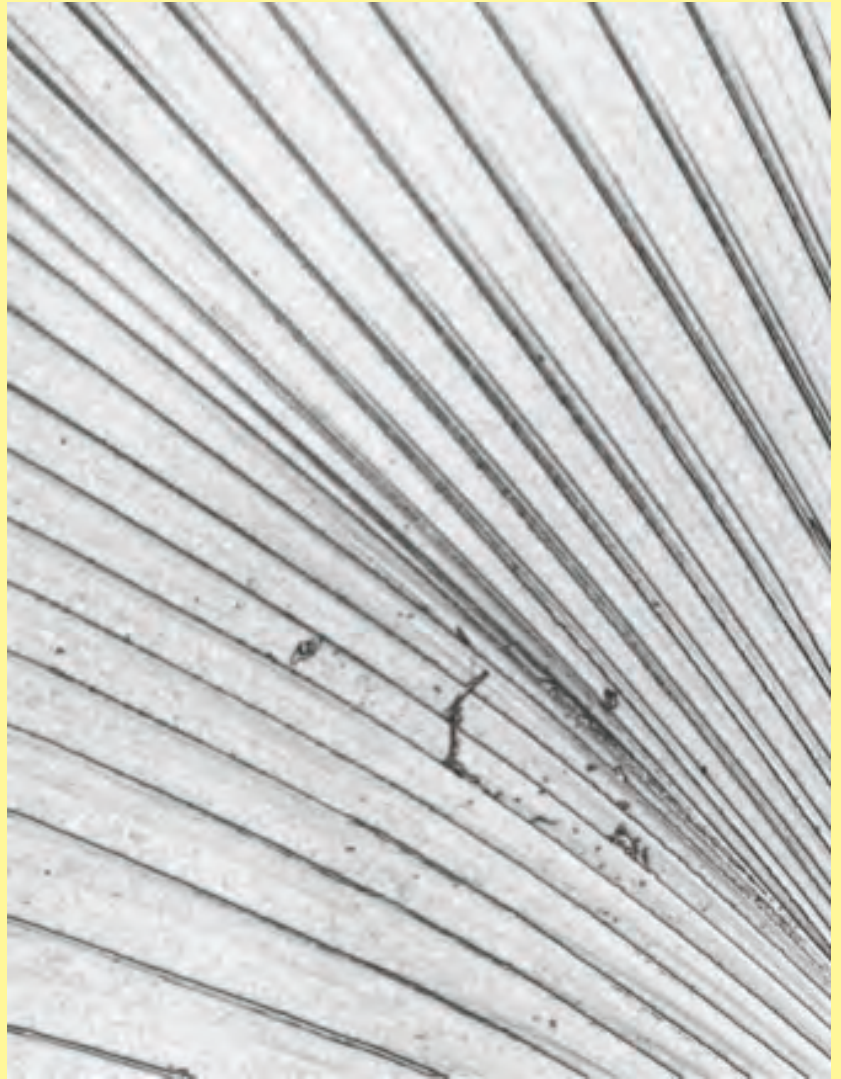

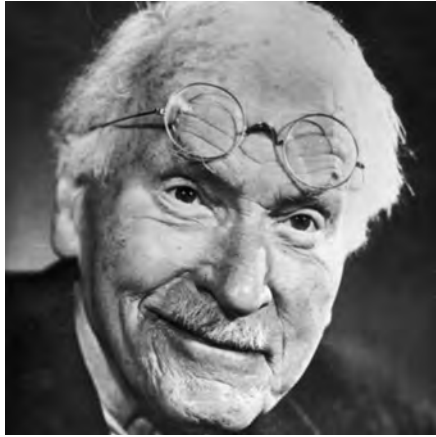

Understood as an image that represents much more than its mere concrete form, the symbol opens a window onto the very roots of the world. It can be experienced as a revelation, but also used as a key to translation. If becoming possessed by a symbol imprisons us, then entering into dialogue with it liberates energy. Thus the symbolic equation is to depth psychology what the mathematical equation is to the natural sciences. It allows powerful analysis and forges deeply attuned solutions. The 'as if' personality as linked with narcissism propels the Jungian process of individuation. The clinical material and dreams show internal splits and fractured selves. Emphasized is the concept of dissociation and its relationship to narcissism. Individuation calls for a deepening through accessing the shadow and connecting to the larger scope of the personality, the self.

The presentation uses a composite clinical example and the life and poetry of Sylvia Plath, American poetess of the mid-twentieth century.
