1.1 IMPORTANT UPDATES TO THE REGULATIONS

a) In-person training as default	
Int./CE (No indication in the current regulations)	All personal training analysis, case work, supervision and case colloquia mentioned in the Regulations must be in person unless explicitly stated otherwise.
b) Symbol paper reader	
Int. 8.2.1, 8.3.13 / CE 4.2 A reader is selected from the Examiners List.	A reader is selected from the ISAP analysts in any training status.
c) AC member's other functions	
Int. (No indication in the current regulations)	AC members of a candidate can be examiners, exam assistants, and/or supervisors for the candidate.
d) Case registration	
Int. (No indication in the current regulations)	All case work which is conducted as an analyst-in-training must be registered even after the minimum required hours is reached, and supervision must be continued in every case.
e) Personal analysis as admission requirement	
Int. 5.1 Personal analysis: upon applying, one must have completed at least 50 hours of Jungian analysis with an IAAP member.	Personal analysis: upon applying, one must have completed at least 50 hours of Jungian analysis with an IAAP member. If analysis was not conducted in person or was with an ISAP diploma candidate or with a candidate of an IAAP recognised training institute, those hours are accepted for admission, but not credited toward the training program.
f) Cost of assessment of academic degree prior to application	
Int. 5.1 (No indication in the current Regulations)	Applicant must pay CHF 150.-, if she/he wishes her/his academic degree to be assessed prior to submitting his/her application for admission.

h) Training analysis not to be covered by health insurance

* To be covered by the ISAP's Malpractice insurance:
Basic Condition (case work in-person)

- A candidate works in Switzerland or in Liechtenstein
- A client's domicile or physical presence has to be in Switzerland or in Liechtenstein

Basic Condition (case work with online devices)

- A candidate works in Switzerland or in Liechtenstein
- A client's domicile or physical presence can be anywhere (worldwide, including USA and Canada)

90 working days allowance

Case work continues to be covered out of the above basic conditions for up to **90** consecutive working days. That is: A candidate temporarily works outside Switzerland and Liechtenstein (except USA and Canada).

If a candidate continues to work more than **90** consecutive working days outside of Switzerland or Liechtenstein, he/she is advised to organise his/her own insurance coverage.
