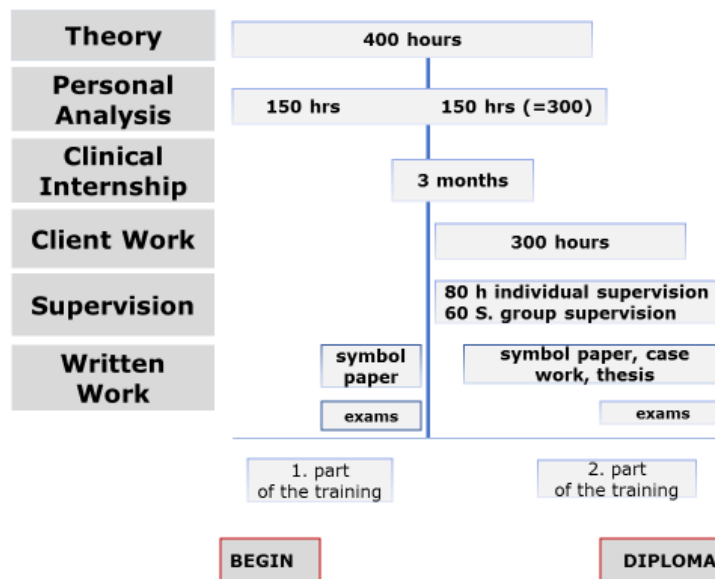

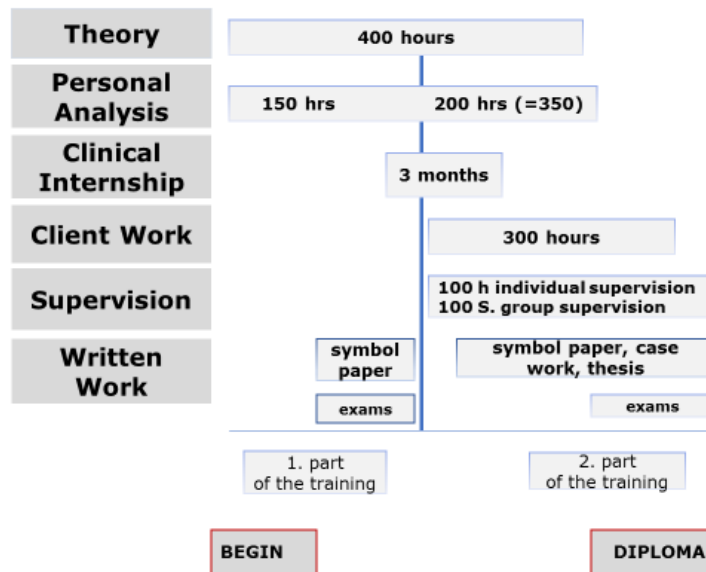

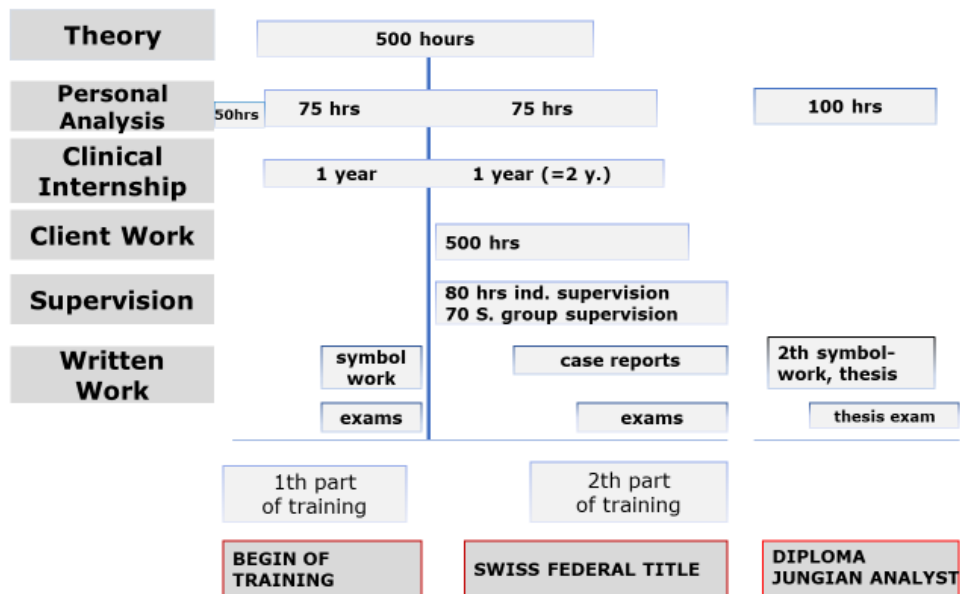
Time bar Diploma in Analytical Psychology C.G. Jung (Jungian Analyst)
