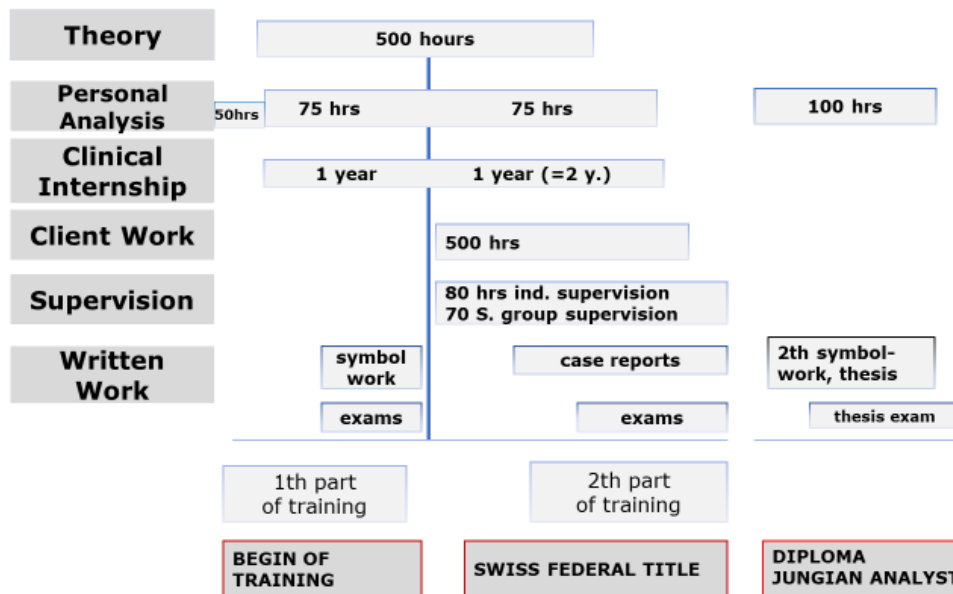

Training Program	Federal title in psychotherapy enabling a cantonal license in Switzerland Prerequisite: Master degree in clinical psychology or psychology with a minor in psychopathology
Duration	4 years (minimum); the semester begins in Spring and Fall parallel with part time work
Admission requirements	50 h Jungian analysis Minimum age 26
Curriculum	500 hrs theory 200 hrs personal analysis 80 hrs individual supervision 70 sessions group supervision 2 years clinical internship, 500 hrs work with client Written papers and exams
